





Breakdown of generation costs for different types of electricity










Laws enacted by national legislature



Laws enacted by prefectural legislatures







Queensland	Yes	No	Pressure on Queensland government to allow uranium mining.

#### Potential federal takeover of uranium regulation

- Contentious takeover (under Howard government)
  - Corporations power (s 51(xx))
    - "Foreign corporations, and trading or financial corporations formed within the limits of the Commonwealth."
    - eg Work Choices legislation
  - External affairs power (s 51(xxix)) and incidental power (s 51(xxxix))

#### Potential federal takeover of uranium regulation

- Amicable takeover (under Labor government?)
  - Referral of State legislative power to the Commonwealth (s 51(xxxvii))
    - eg Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)
